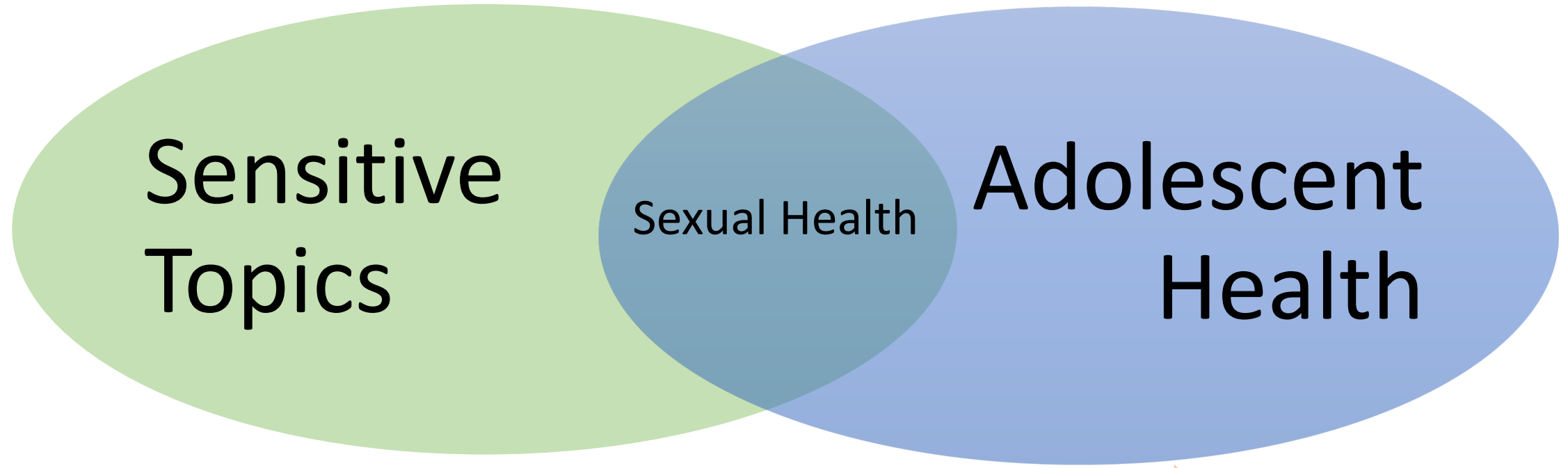
Conversation starter

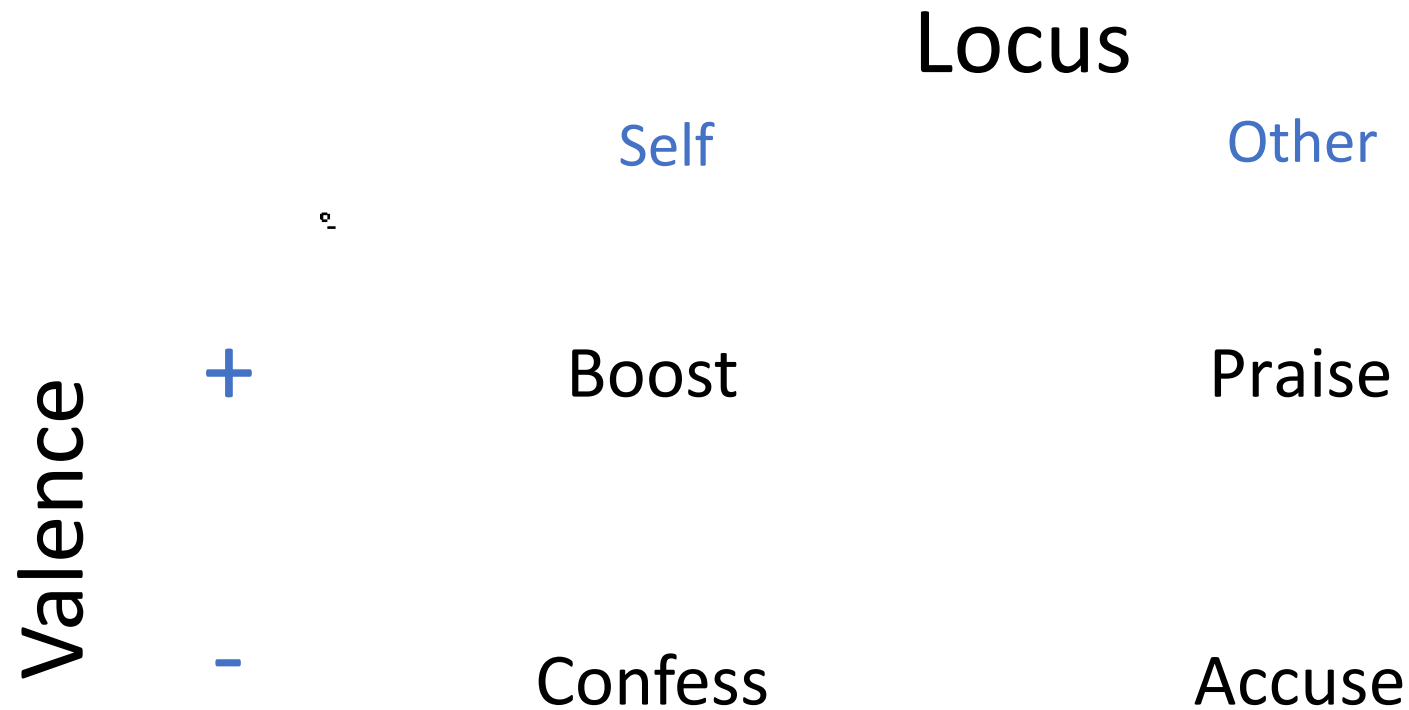

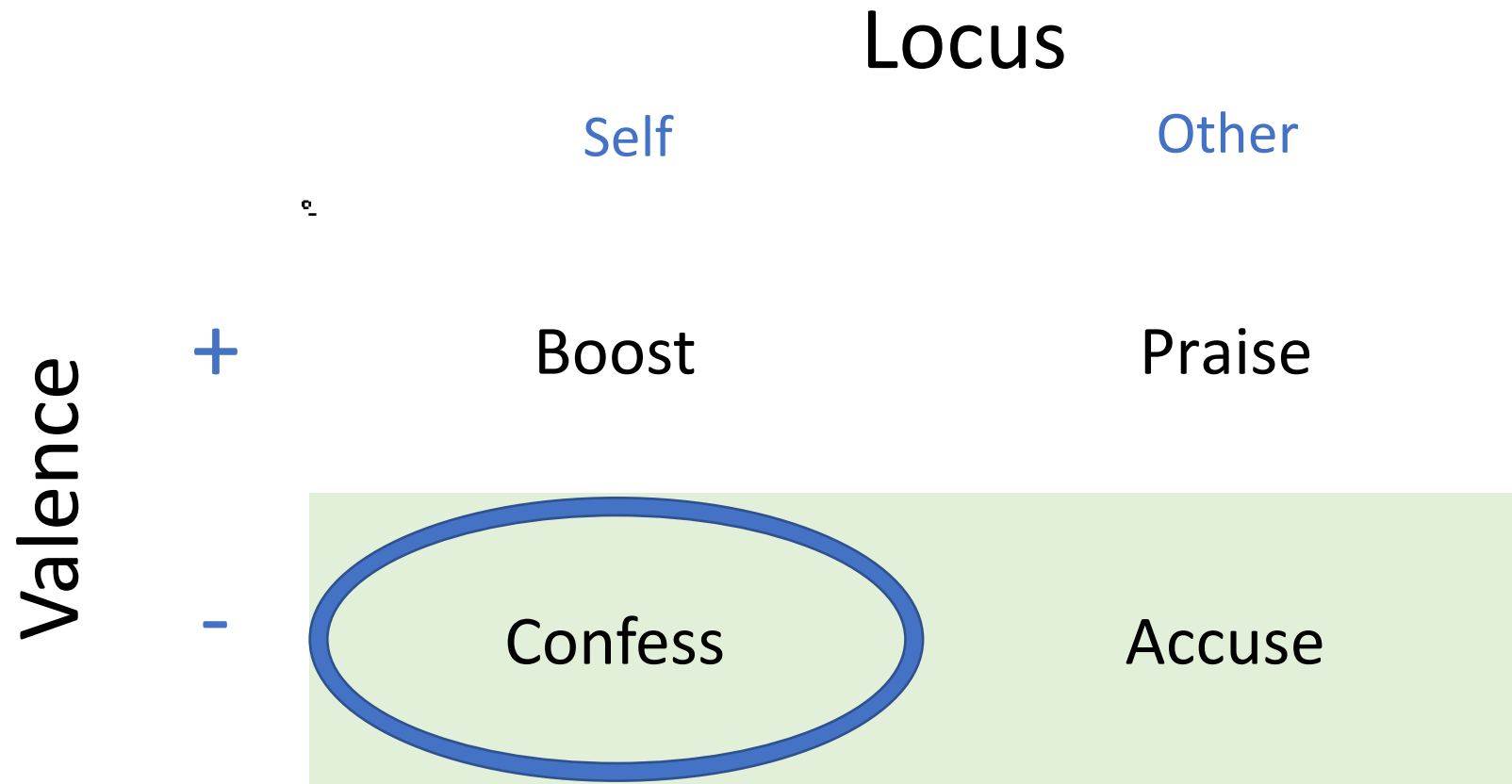

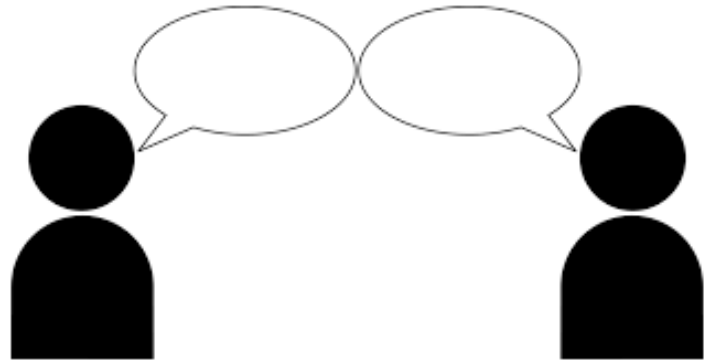
Impression Management Model



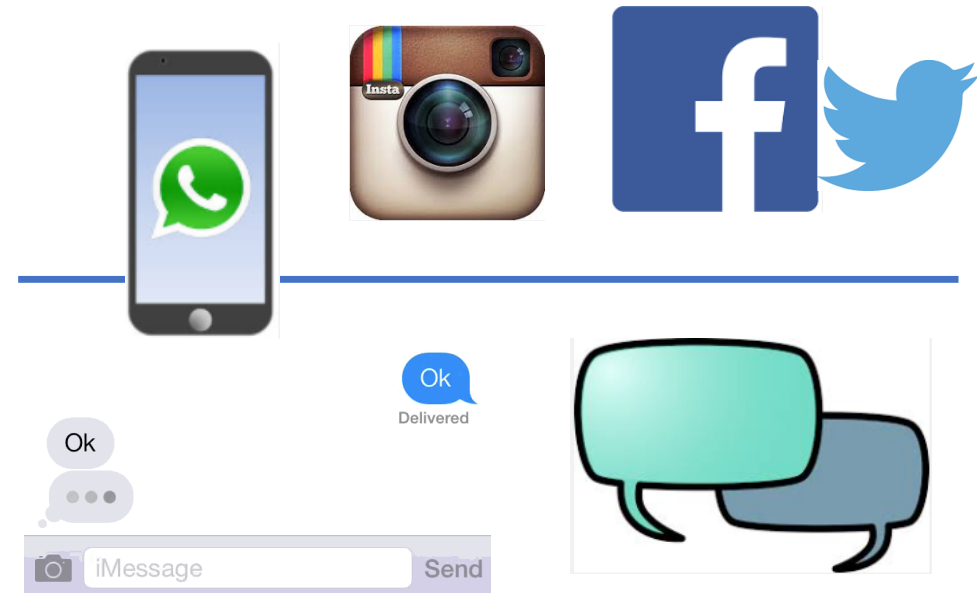
Impression Management Model
